

### **Entrance Antiphon** (Psalm 129.3-4)

### First Reading (2 Kings 5.14-17)

Beloved: Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David — that is my Gospel, for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained.

Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory.

The saying is sure: If we have died with him, we will also live with him; if we endure, we will also reign with him; if we deny him, he will also deny us; if we are faithless, he remains faithful — for he cannot deny himself.

### Gospel (Luke 17.11-19)

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee.

As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, they called out, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!"

When Jesus saw them, he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were made clean. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan.

Then Jesus asked, "Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?"

Then Jesus said to the Samaritan, "Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well."

#### **SUNDAY'S REFLECTION: Gratitude and Thanksgiving**

In today's Gospel, Jesus cures 10 lepers; but only one of them, realizing that he has been healed, comes back to thank Him. This leads Jesus to ask the question: "Where are the other nine?" We are reminded today that, often, in nine out of 10 instances, we forget to thank God. Yes, many times we take God's blessings for granted, and we lack gratitude in our lives. Have you thanked God this morning, just for the fact that you are still alive?

Early on in life, many of us were taught by our parents to be grateful. As children we knew how to say "thank you" because of our littleness and dependence. Now that we have become adults, we sometimes forget to be grateful because of our false sense of security and independence.

In gratitude, allow me to share these lines of a song: "When I look back, and think of all the people in my life, I think of you for you're a part of my life, a special part of my life. When I recall the many phases and places in my life, I think of you for you're a part of my life, you're a special part of my life. So now, I want to thank you for your presence in my life. I want to tell you I appreciate your love. Thank you with all my heart. If I in any way have hurt you, it was never my desire. I had my faults, but God knows how much I've tried .... You're a special part of my life!"

Lord, help us not to lose our sense of gratitude, and help us to just "continue loving." Amen.
